

## See Seattle from up high this season

Enjoy spectacular views from the Smith Tower, the Great Wheel, the Columbia Center's Sky View Observatory and the iconic Space Needle

That fortified us for a visit to the <u>Seattle Art Museum</u>, just a few blocks away. The stunning centerpiece of its lobby is *Middle Fork*, a huge suspended sculpture made of thousands of pieces of reclaimed old-growth cedar that recreates the contours of a 140-year-old western hemlock tree.

Inside its galleries, *Flesh & Blood* is a well-curated exhibition of 17<sup>th</sup>-century Italian masterpieces by renowned Renaissance artists, including Raphael and Titian and Baroque masters such as Cavallino, is on display until the end of January. And check out *Octopus Wrap* by Brazilian artist Regina Silveira, the latest installation at the museum's Olympic Sculpture Park — it wraps the Pavilion's walls in a mind-blowing pattern that questions our perception of reality.
